GRANT APPLICATIONS MUST BE RECEIVED <u>BEFORE</u> TRAINING BEGINS.

Registration begins November 24, 2014. Early registration is encouraged, as class size is limited. Payment <u>must be</u> made prior to attending the class. Registrations are due by 1700 on February 6th, 2015. Substitutions are welcome by close of registration; however walk-ins will not be accepted because of limited class size.

CHECK-IN:

For S-130/190: begins at 1700 on Feb 10^{th} , then again at 0700 on Feb 11^{th}

For Mini Engine Academy: begins at 1600 on Feb $13^{\rm th}$

All other classes: begins at 1600 on Feb $13^{th},$ then again at 0700 on Feb 14^{th}

LODGING:

Barracks are available on the base on a first come, first serve basis. If this is the option you choose, please bring blankets and sheets, or sleeping bag, and pillow. Don't forget to bring toiletries and towels.

MEALS:

\$15/day for meals or \$7.50/meal (breakfast and lunch) – make checks payable to Dam VFD and bring to check-in <u>(SEPARATE FROM TUITION)</u> Dinner will be provided on Saturday, Feb 14th ONLY for \$10/plate. This event will provide training to volunteer and agency wildland firefighters. The Central Texas Wildfire Academy is striving to offer a variety of training for all those dedicated to protecting lives and property.

The Texas Interagency Wildfire and Incident Management Academies provide training to wildland firefighters from Texas and through the United States to meet National Wildfire Coordination Group Standards. The Capital Area Academy, held in Bastrop, Texas during the month of October, and the East Texas Academy, during the month of May in Lufkin, Texas, provide classroom and "hands-on" training to more than 800 students in firefighting, supervisory, and prevention techniques.


To enhance the Wildland Firefighters' knowledge, utilizing NWCG standards to promote safe and cost effective operations.

Participants MUST be 18 years old in order to take courses.

Class Descriptions

S-130/190 Basic Firefighter Training February 11 - 15, 2015 0800 - 1700 This introductory course is designed to train entry-level firefighters. The student will gain an understanding of the basic incident management organization, firefighting techniques, suppression equipment, safety, strategy/tactics, along with basic fire behavior. Field exercises will be performed for valuable hands-on training. This course is designed for entry-level firefighters. *Prerequisite(s): NONE **Limited to 40 students LIVE FIRE EXERCISE!! Scheduled for February 15th, full PPE is required to participate. This includes nomex shirt and pants (or coveralls), leather gloves, eye protection, helmet, leather boots, fire pack, and fire shelter. S-219 Firing Operations February 13 - 15, 2015 0800 - 1700 The course introduces the roles and responsibilities of a firing boss (FIRB) and outlines duties of other personnel who may engage firing operations. The course discusses and illustrates common firing devices and techniques. Although comprehensive in nature, the course work is not a substitute for the dynamic fire environment. The course provides students with important information regarding general tasks required to be successful. This course was developed using a **blended approach** to learning, meaning that it contains a mix of online and instructor-led training (ILT). Students are required to complete the online training portion of the course prior to taking the ILT. This course is targeted towards personnel desiring to be qualified as firing boss, single resource (FIRB) and firefighter type 1 and 2 personnel looking to gain valuable information to conduct or participate in firing operations. *Prerequisite(s): Qualified as a firefighter type 2 (FFT2); successful completion of online training **Limited to 20 students LIVE FIRE EXERCISE!! Scheduled for February 15th, full PPE is required to participate. This includes nomex shirt and pants (or coveralls), leather gloves, eye protection, helmet, leather boots, fire pack, and fire shelter. February 14 - 15, 2015 0800 - 1700 **Dozer Operations** This course is designed for the equipment operators that will be working in a wildland fire environment. It will cover basic dozer and heavy equipment tactics, safety, personal protective equipment, and supervision. Successful completion of S-130/190/I-100/L-180 is not required, but is recommended. **Limited to 20 students LIVE FIRE EXERCISE!! Scheduled for February 15th, full PPE is required to participate. This includes nomex shirt and pants (or coveralls), leather gloves, eye protection, helmet, leather boots, fire pack, and fire shelter. February 13, 2015 1900 - 2200 February 14 – 15, 2015 0800 - 1700 Mini Wildland Engine Academy The Mini Engine Academy is a 16 hour course designed to expose the student to various aspects of wildland engine operations with an emphasis on practical application and safe engine practices. Participation from local fire agencies is encouraged. *Prerequisite(s): None **Limited to 20 students

<u>LIVE FIRE EXERCISE!</u> Scheduled for February 15th, full PPE is required to participate. This includes nomex shirt and pants (or coveralls), leather gloves, eye protection, helmet, leather boots, fire pack, and fire shelter.
